Epicurus


Plato (428-427 BCE)

- "Evils... can never pass away; for there must always remain something which is antagonistic to good.
- Having no place among the Gods in heaven, of necessity they hover around the earthly nature and this mortal sphere.
- Wherefore we ought to fly away from earth to heaven as quickly as we can; and to fly away is to become like God, as far as this is possible; and to become like Him is to become holy and just and wise."




Augustine of Hippo (354-430 CE)

- "For when the will abandons what is above itself, and turns to what is lower, it becomes evil—
- not because that is evil to which it turns, but because the turning itself is wicked."
- "Free-will was the cause of our doing ill."
- "Perversion of the will, turned aside from...God [to lesser things]."



Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274 CE)

- "Good signifies 'perfect being'
- Evil signifies nothing else than 'privation of perfect being.'
- "A thing is called evil if it *lacks a* perfection it ought to have.
- If a man lacks the sense of sight, this is an evil for him. But the same lack is not an evil for a stone, for the stone is not equipped by nature to have the faculty of sight."




Benedict Spinoza (1632-1677)

- Is the difference between good and evil merely one of personal inclinations?
- "So everyone, by the highest right of Nature, judges what is good and what is evil, considers his own advantage according to his own temperament...,
- "In the state of nature, wrong-doing is impossible; or, if anyone does wrong, it is to himself, not to another. For no one by the law of nature is bound to please another, unless he chooses, nor to hold anything to be good or evil, but what he himself, according to his own temperament, pronounces to be so."




Ralph Waldo Emerson (1803-1882)

- What have I to do with the sacredness of traditions, if I live wholly from within?
- My friend suggested, "But these impulses may be from below, not from above."
- I replied, "They do not seem to me to be such; but if I am the Devil's child, I will live then from the Devil."
- No law can be sacred to me but that of my nature.
- Good and bad are but names very readily transferable to that or this; the only right is what is after my constitution, the only wrong what is against it."



Fredrick Nietzsche (1844-1900)

- "That which an age feels to be evil
- is usually an untimely echo of what was formerly considered good — the atavism of an old ideal."

 - synonyms: cruel, mischievous, pernicious, malignant, malign, baleful, vicious;
 - antonyms: good, beneficial
- (of something seen or smelled) extremely unpleasant." a bathroom with an evil smell"
 - <u>synonyms</u>: unpleasant, disagreeable, nasty, horrible, foul, disgusting, filthy, vile, noxious"a n evil smell"
 - antonyms: pleasant

Noun: evil: profound immorality, wickedness, and depravity, especially when regarded as a supernatural force. ("the world is stalked by relentless evil")

- synonyms: wickedness, bad, badness, wrongdoing, sin, ill, immor ality, vice, iniquity, degeneracy, corruption, depravity, villainy, nefari ousness, malevolence
- a manifestation of this, especially in people's actions.
 - synonyms: abomination, atrocity, obscenity, outrage, enormity, crime, monstrosity, barbarity"the evils of war"
- something that is harmful or undesirable. "sexism, racism, and all other unpleasant social evils"

"Second Coming" by William Butler Yeats (1919)

Turning and turning in the widening gyre The falcon cannot hear the falconer; Things fall apart; the centre cannot hold; Mere anarchy is loosed upon the world, The blood-dimmed tide is loosed, and everywhere The ceremony of innocence is drowned; The best lack all conviction, while the worst Are full of passionate intensity.

Surely some revelation is at hand; Surely the Second Coming is at hand. The Second Coming! Hardly are those words out When a vast image out of *Spiritus Mundi* Troubles my sight: somewhere in sands of the desert A shape with lion body and the head of a man, A gaze blank and pitiless as the sun, Is moving its slow thighs, while all about it Reel shadows of the indignant desert birds. - Sadistic, Cruel (lack of compassion/empathy)
- Divisive
- "Evil doers" [Foucault's anti-essentialism]
- Contextual/Situational
