John Wycliffe

- 1382 translated Bible (Latin "Vulgate") into the English vernacular.
- Anti-clerical and taught that individuals should study the Bible for themselves
- <u>1384</u> died, but in 1428, his corpse was exhumed, burned, and the ashes thrown into river

Michael Servetus (1511 - 1553)

- [1455: Gutenberg invents moveable type printing press]
- <u>1531</u>: *De Trinitatis Erroribis* ("On the Errors of the Trinity") read Bible for himself and discovered there was "not one word about the Trinity" (talking about God in three ways is different from the doctrine of the Trinity was wasn't established until the 4th century).
 - no *homo(o)ousios* ("Great Vowel Debate")
- <u>1533</u>: *The Restoration of Christianit*
- <u>Minister-scientist</u> 1st in the West to grasp the circuit of the blood in the heart and lungs.
- <u>1553</u> Executed/martyred by John Calvin in Geneva for anti-Trinitarianism and anti-paedobaptism

- I. Why Letters? If Jesus was coming back soon, then need "immediate literature"
- II. 13 letters/epistles attributed to Paul
 - a. 9 to communities (Rom, 1-2 Cor, Gal, Eph, Phil, Col, 1-2 Thess)
 - b. 4 to individuals (1-2 Tim, Titus, Phlm)
 - c. Descending length
 - d. Catholic Epistles (James, Peter, John, Jude) order of Gal 2:9

Scribe (1 Cor 16:21; Gal 6:11; II Thess 3:17; Col 4:18; Rom 16:22; I Pet 5:12)
