Background: Utilitarianism of Jeremy Bentham & John Stuart Mills

- Bentham: capacity for suffering as criterion
- Spectrum of Sentience: stone (none), mouse (some), human (more, depending on age, etc.)
- Specieism

Peter Singer (1946 -) - professor of bioethics at Princeton University, one of the best-known, influential, and widely read of all contemporary philosophers (1975: *Animal Liberation*)

"Unsanctifying" Human Life (vs. "Quality of Life" for all sentient "beings")

- 1. <u>Human population:</u> ~1 billion in 1800 to > 7 billion today: <u>census.gov/popclock</u>
 - a. <u>Elizabeth Kolbert's Sixth Extinction</u>: didn't know about any extinction until 1700s.
 - b. <u>Now</u>: Anthropocene era
 - c. Sapiens: A Brief History of Humankind by Yuval Noah Harari
 - a. Humans as (one among many) members of the Animal Kingdom
 - d. Parallels: how enslaved/woman/animals viewed historically
