# The Pastoral Epistles ("Pastorals")

#### **Church Structure**

- Elders (presyteroi, "old") Need to be 60 (1 Tim 5:9)
- Bishop (episkopos, "overseer") Married (1 Tim 3:1ff)
- Deacons (1 Tim 3:8-13)
- Pastor (vs. "spirit-led")

Order? 2 Timothy: Paul dies; Titus: less developed church structure; 1 Tim: more developed structure

- <u>Ehrman</u>: there were pseudonymous writings that were not included in the canon; question is whether the pastoral are among them.
- Majority of scholars: variant 4 (all from same pen)
- Brown: variant 3

## A Pastoral Letter: 1 Timothy

- Previous Co-sender, now recipient (2 Cor, Phil, Col, 1-2 Thess, Phil)
- **Ephesus** (1:3)
- Women (2:8ff)
- Anti-gnostic? (1:4)

## **Another Pastoral Letter: 2 Timothy**

- **Genealogy**—3<sup>rd</sup> generation Christian (1:5)
- Inspired Scripture (3:15-16)

## Pastoral Letter, take 3: Titus

- **Introduction** (1:1-4) long and formal
- Changing the message? (1 Tim 3:10 vis-à-vis Mt 18:21)

**Hebrews** - 1:1-3; best Greek, anonymous (2:3), dating (10:1-2), high Christology (1:8-9)

**1 Peter** - 1:1-2; Babylon (5:13), "Descended into Hell" (3:18-20; 4:6)

**James** - 1:1; Luther: "right strawy epistle"; almost no Christology (1:1; 2:1)

Jude - Origen: "sound words of heavenly grace"; many textual variants; Lectionary: 17, 20-25

- 2 Peter Last chronologically, high likelihood of pseudonymity. Date...after...
  - The apostolic generation was dead (2 Pet 3:4) thus after 80 CE
  - 1 Peter (2 Peter 3:1) thus, after 80 CE
  - <u>Jude</u> thus after 90...copies
  - Pauline letters collected (2 Pet 3:15-16) not much before 100 CE

## **Revelation** - 65% of verses have OT allusions; worst Greek

- Apocalyptic Literature: apokalypsis ("unveiling") symbolic language, dualistic, end is near
- Seven Churches (Rev 4:4, elders)
- 666 (Rev 13:18) gematria, Nero Caesar, 616.
- Canonicity: Luther: Secondary; Zwingli: denied; Calvin: no commentary
- Rev 22:19 not NT
- The Rapture Exposed: The Message of Hope in The Book of Revelation by Barbara R. Rossing
- Breaking the Code: Understanding the Book of Revelation by Bruce M. Metzger
