

PRESIDENT'S REPORT JUNE 4, 2023

In April I gave my "Reflections from the Board" at the Stewardship Meeting and I pretty much spelled out the majority of the things that the Board is doing, so in case you were not present for that meeting, I will give you the highlights of that and add a few additional things.

Last August, the Board met for our annual retreat which means we got together on a Saturday morning to eat donuts and talk about what we see as our goals and objectives for the coming year.

We started with some quotes from the adrienne marie brown's book *Emergent Strategy* which gave us some things to think about as we began to embark on the coming year. Some of these include:

- Small is good (meaning that we don't have to build the Titanic to cross the Potomac River. Sometimes small changes can still make a big difference)
- Change is constant (Covid certainly showed us that)
- Always enough time for the right work (Spinning wheels just makes you dizzy, so instead, take the time to do it right...)

In terms of Presence, we continue to support local organizations that share our principles for social justice both through our monthly split-plate giving as well as our physical presence at social justice events and rallies.
