

Notes to accompany FY22/23 UUCF Operating Budget

- 1. In contrast to the budgets of the last few years, this budget shows a small "on paper" surplus rather than a deficit. It projects total income of \$554,349 and total expenses of \$553,215.
- 2. The budget includes a welcome increase in Pledge Income from the successful Spring 2022 Pledge Drive.
- 3. This budget achieves a long-desired goal of raising all UUCF staff salaries to the midpoint of the UUA's Midsize II "Fair Compensation" salary range.
- 4. This budget applies \$12,000 from a newly created Salary Administration Reserve (SAR) of \$68,169 to help keep UUCF salaries fair and competitive. The original source of the SAR funds was the PPP grants ("Paycheck Protection Program") that UUCF received from the Federal Government.
- 5. The budget includes a partial restoration of rental income from Congregation Kol Ami, a Reform Jewish Congregation, which has rented space from UUCF for many years.
- 6. The budget anticipates a 6-week overlap period between our departing Director of Religious Education (DRE) and our new DRE.
- 7. Several of the estimates assume that UUCF will recommence two Sunday services in the fall of 2022. This has not yet been decided. If we do continue with only a single Sunday service, we anticipate spending less than the listed budget estimates.
